

BEST PRACTICE 1



Towards Eco-Friendly Campus



Objectives of the Practice:

- To create awareness regarding environmental issues amongst the students like various types of pollution, global warming, increasing health issues due to pollution, etc.
- 2. To educate the students about the plantation of plants as a means to pollution prevention.
- 3. To make the campus plastic-free and eco-friendly.
- To make our students more sensitive and responsible by nurturing love and respect for nature.

The Context:

Environmental issues are vital to address as it affects our life in a tremendous way. It becomes a responsibility as an educational institution to spread consciousness about the importance of conservation of environment both within the campus and in the neighboring areas. Pollution poses a great challenge to humanity; therefore, collective efforts are made to create awareness as well as to promote eco-friendly environment.

The Practice:

- 1. Attempts are made to make the campus plastic free. Usage of plastic cups and drinking glasses are replaced by paper cups and glass bottles.
- 2. To sensitize the students and staff regarding the safe and sustainable use of potable drinking water, we have provided (RO aqua-guard) drinking water facility within the campus.
- 3. The institution insists on separating biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes by having separate waste-bins.
- 4. During programme of all kinds, watering of the plant and planting of plants are mandatory instead of lighting the lamp. Twice a year planting is done by the NSS and NCC cadets within the campus and in the neighboring areas.
- Plants are also distributed in the areas nearby as an awareness campaign regarding the importance of planting and balanced environment.
- Campus is a smoking free zone. Smoking inside the campus is strictly prohibited.

NSS undertakes the project of cleaning the campus at regular intervals.

The department of Geography undertakes environment assessment campaigns. Trees and plants in the campus are numbered and named.

Campus is growing into plastic free zone. Trees and plants are planted and are thriving. Several awareness programmes regarding the conservation of water, forest, climate change, waste management, pollution control and planting are organized in the campus for the staff and students and in the villages nearby.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Environment degradation is a huge problem. It demands sufficient resources to meet the expenses required in and around the campus. The support of the local administration for various environment projects would be beneficial in promoting and practicing eco-friendly measures. The institution manages the cost of campaigns, projects and activities from the college fund.

BEST PRACTICE 2

Title of the Practice:

Student Smart Card (College ID Card cum Library Card)

Objectives of the Practice:

- To simplify everyday operation of library.
- 2. To reduce operational cost by issuing one card to students that fulfills two purposes.
- To save time of both students and library staff while providing library services.

Students are less burdened about carrying and maintaining two cards simultaneously.

To ensure better monitoring of the circulation of books.

The Context:

Munshi Premchand Mahavidyalaya has the objective to instill a healthy ambitious attitude within our students which is pre-requisite to succeed and sustain in a highly competitive world. To this aim, the current practice has proved effective since it allows us to better scrutinize the performance of our students. At a glance, we can identify the students who are keen about visiting the library for knowledge enhancement. Besides, it has brought substantial efficiency in library operations.

It also contributes to our motive of reduction of paper usage which is a major environmental issue.

The Practice:

With the purchase of the KOHA software, a full automation system was required wherein each library book was allotted a bar code and maintaining online student data was mandated. So, all the members of the Library Committee of Munshi Premchand Mahavidyalaya including the Principal, HODs of all departments and the library staff unanimously decided to introduce the 'Smart Card'.

Herein, first the Smart Card of a student is scanned, followed by the scanning of the bar code of the library book he/she wants to borrow, and the data is immediately registered in the online database of our college. Also, offline records are maintained via register.

Evidence of Success:

The implementation of this practice has substantially improved the functionality of the library system. Students are showing more keenness and frequency in their visit to the library. It has also resolved the space issue since manual management of library cards require separate cabinet or stacks which is no longer required.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

The library work gets hurdled in the face of loadshedding since our college isn't equipped with any alternative power resource like Inverter or Diesel Generator set. Though library operation has become smoother but there is a need for more desktops and barcode scanners. Also, a library cataloguing machine along with complete ICT

facilities for students are highly required.
