

Course Specific Outcomes (CSO):

1. CC Paper-I: History of India-I (from earliest time to 300 AD)

Students will gain insight into the early stages of human life and cultural developments in ancient India. They will explore the social, religious, political, and cultural evolution of early Indian societies, with an emphasis on the dynamic shifts that marked the period.

2. CC Paper-II: Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the Ancient World

This course will provide students with an understanding of the progression of human societies and the transformations of ancient civilisations. It also covers the historical development of the Earth, its inhabitants, and their societal structures.

3. GE-Paper-I: History of India from Earliest Times up to 1193 CE

Students will delve into India's history from its early beginnings through to the arrival of Islam. They will gain a detailed understanding of the societal, cultural, and political developments of this expansive period.

4. CC Paper-III: History of India-II (from 300AD to 750AD)

This paper introduces students to the history of ancient India, focusing on the socio-economic and cultural developments during this period, including key political events and cultural transformations.

5. CC Paper-IV: Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the Medieval World

Students will explore key events and developments in medieval history, including the rise of empires such as Rome, the social and economic conditions of the period, and the spread of Islam across the world.

6. GE Paper-II: History of India from 1193 to 1950 CE

Students will gain a comprehensive understanding of India's medieval history, including its social, economic, and political aspects. The course will also cover the rise of nationalism, the social reform movement, and the journey towards independence.

7. CC Paper-V: History of India-III (750-1206 AD)

This course will provide students with insights into the final phase of ancient India, covering the emergence of feudalism, the urbanisation process, and the growth of trade and commerce during this era.

8. CC Paper-VI: Rise of the Modern West-I

Students will study the history of Europe from the Middle Ages to the Modern Era, focusing on the economic, social, and political transformations of the Renaissance and Medieval Europe.

9. CC Paper-VII: History of India-IV (1206-1550)

This course will examine the establishment of Islamic rule in India, exploring the political, social, and economic transformations brought about by the arrival of Islam and its governance systems.

10. CC Sec-Paper-I: Understanding Heritage or Archives & Museum

Students will gain a deeper understanding of the country's cultural heritage through the study of traditions, continuity, and the preservation of cultural practices. They will also explore the role of museums and archives in preserving historical knowledge.

11. GE Paper-III: History of India from Earliest Times up to 1193 CE

Students will study the history of India from its earliest periods through to the advent of Islam, with a focus on the key social, cultural, and political events that shaped ancient India.

12. CC Paper-VIII: Rise of the Modern West-II

This course will examine the history of modern Europe, with a focus on the development of mercantilism and the significant events leading to the American War of Independence.

13. CC Paper-IX: History of India-V (1550-1605)

Students will learn about the arrival of the Mughals in India, exploring their political ideology, governance systems, and cultural contributions during this pivotal period in Indian history.

14. CC Paper-X: History of India-VI (1605-1750)

This course will focus on the reign of Aurangzeb, examining the controversies surrounding his rule and the beginning of the decline of the Mughal Empire, alongside the contributions of the Mughal era.

15. CC SEC Paper-II: Art Appreciation – An Introduction to Indian Art or Understanding Popular Culture

Students will explore Indian cultural heritage, including the arts and architecture. They will study the historical significance of temples and mosques, uncovering the rich cultural legacy left by Indian rulers.

16. GE Paper-IV: History of India from Earliest Times up to 1193 CE

This course offers a comprehensive study of India's medieval history, including key political, social, and economic developments. Students will also explore the rise of nationalism, social reform movements, and India's path to independence.

17. CC Paper-XI: History of Modern Europe-I (1789-1939)

Students will study the significant events of the French Revolution, the rise of Napoleon, and the emergence of nationalism in Europe, focusing on how these developments reshaped European societies.

18. CC Paper-XII: History of India-VII (1750-1857)

This course explores the social, political, and economic transformations in 18th century India, including the arrival of the East India Company and its impact on India's policies and governance.

19. CC-DSE Paper-I: History of Modern East Asia-I (1840-1949)

Students will explore the political, social, and economic history of China during the 19th and 20th centuries, gaining valuable insights into the significant historical events that shaped modern Chinese society.

20. CC-DSE Paper-II: History of Modern East Asia-II – Japan (1868-1945)

This paper will offer an in-depth study of Japan's historical development from the Meiji Restoration to the end of World War II, emphasising the political and economic transformations that led Japan to become a world power.

21. CC Paper-XIII: History of India-VIII (1857-1950)

Students will examine the impacts of British rule in India, focusing on the history of exploitation, peasant revolts, the development of Indian nationalism, and the events leading to India's independence.

22. CC Paper-XIV: History of Modern Europe-II (1780-1939)

This course will cover key events in the modern era, including the rise of Marxism, the Russian Revolution, the expansion of capitalism, and the onset of imperialism, culminating in the Great War.

23. CC-DSE-III: History of North Bengal-I

This course will provide students with a specialised understanding of the history of North Bengal, focusing on its unique historical and cultural significance within the broader context of regional and national history.

24. CC-DSE-IV: History of North Bengal-II

Students will explore the impact of British imperialism in North Bengal, learning about the distinctive historical characteristics of the region and how they shaped its socio-political landscape.
