A) About College :

For a long time, the dream of establishing a college in and around Sevoke Road, Siliguri, was harboured by the people, aiming to broaden access to higher education for the local populace. After securing government approval and affiliation from the University of North Bengal, Munshi Premchand Mahavidyalaya came into existence in July 2008, aiming to fulfill this aspiration. Initially located in the premises of Siliguri Shewmangal Memorial Hindi High School, the college commenced its journey with 243 students and a few number of guest and part-time teachers. Then the college got shifted to Buddha Bharati High School, Haiderpara.

In May 2010, marking a significant milestone, the college moved to its independent campus located at 2nd Mile, Sevoke Road, Siliguri. This relocation marked the beginning of a new chapter, symbolizing growth and progress. Initially offering courses in Elective Bengali, Elective English, Education, Political Science, and History as General subjects, the institution progressively expanded its academic world. Hindi and Sociology were introduced as General Subjects in subsequent academic sessions, followed by the introduction of Honours courses in Bengali, History, Education, and English over the years. The inclusion of Political Science (Hons.), Geography (Hons and General), Nepali and Economics as General subjects further enriched the academic landscape of the institution, reflecting its commitment to holistic education. The incorporation of NCC as Elective subject further added new dimension to the educational experience.

At present, Munshi Premchand Mahavidyalaya offers a diverse array of courses to cater to the evolving needs of students under the new curriculum and credit framework of NEP, 2022. From the academic year 2024-25 onwards, the college provides two distinct types of courses: **Single Major and Single Minor, along with Three Discipline Specific Multidisciplinary courses**. This strategic expansion underscores the institution's dedication to fostering a robust higher education system in the Siliguri region, catering to a wide spectrum of academic interests and career aspirations. Central to its mission is the goal of advancing higher education and widening access to knowledge. The college's overarching objective resonates with the vision

articulated by the Radhakrishnan Commission on Higher Education (1948-49), emphasizing the transformative potential of education in aligning with societal needs and aspirations. As echoed by the Commission, education serves as a potent instrument for social, economic, and cultural transformation, driving national progress and fostering unity amidst diversity. B) Admission Procedure :

A student may be admitted to B.A. 4-Year Under-Graduate Course if he/she passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary [10+2] Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination recognized by the University as equivalent or passed the qualifying examination in Vocational Stream subjects.

A student will identify **one** Major Course in which he/she will concentrate. Apart from **one** Core Major Course he/she will have to select **one** Minor course. 2) Three Discipline Specific Courses (Multidisciplinary)

He/she will also have to select Inter-disciplinary Courses (IDC) courses, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Value Added Courses (VAC), and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) from the provided pool of courses.

❖ Eligibility Criteria :

B.A. Single Major Single Minor Course : For Unreserved candidates – 55% in aggregate (best of 4 including English) or, if the candidate has secured less than 55% but not less than 50% in aggregate she/he should at least have secured 60% in the concerned subject.

For SC, ST & P.H. candidates – 50% in aggregate (best of 4 including English) or, if the candidate has secured less than 50% but not less than 45% in aggregate she/he should at least have secured 60% in the concerned subject.

Three Discipline Specific Course : For WBCHSE and other Boards, a candidate must pass (10+2) at least four subjects including English as compulsory excluding Environmental Studies/Science.

N.B:-

i) A student will be allowed to take up Bengali, English, Hindi, Nepali, History, Geography, Economics and Political Science as Major/Minor or Discipline Specific subject, if he/she has passed in the said subject at the Higher Secondary Examination [10+2] or any other Board recognized as equivalent by the University.

ii) A student will be allowed to take up Sociology or Education subject if he/she has passed in previous qualifying examination of any stream.

iii) Students opting and getting Geography as a Minor/Discipline Specific subject, will have to deposit Rs. 600/- as Practical Fee at the time of document verification in the college.

❖ Merit Calculation :

Admission to all Course will be based strictly on merit. Merit shall be calculated as per the following formula:

B.A. Single Major Single Minor Course : {Marks obtained in English + Marks obtained in the Subject opted for Honours + best marks of other two subject (excluding the Subject opted for Honours and English)}/4

if the student does not have the specific subject opted for Honours in his/her previous course, the Procedure for merit calculation is : {Marks obtained in English + marks in three best of subject (excluding English)}/4

Three Discipline Specific Course {Marks obtained in English + marks in three best of subject (excluding English)}/4

N.B.: Students from Vocational Stream will not be eligible for Honours Courses.

3. Student's own Caste/PH/VH Certificate from appropriate authority as per Govt. Rule.

N.B.:-

1. If any wrong information is given by the candidate in the application form, his/her Application will be cancelled.
2. College authority reserves the right to cancel any application / admission if the submitted document(s) does not /do not fulfill the admission criteria set up by the University of North Bengal.
3. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary Examination or equivalent Examination in the Year 2022, 2023 and 2024 are eligible to take admission.
4. Students from Vocational Stream will not be eligible for Honours Course.
5. All admission will be provisional and it will be confirmed only after the registration under the University of North Bengal
6. If the Admission is cancelled the Admission fees will be refunded as per UGC rules.
7. The physical verification with all required documents is mandatory.

BREAKUP OF CREDITS AND COURSES:

Every Undergraduate (UG) programme offered by a College shall conform to the Structure specified by the UGC's Framework, 2023. A student of 3 year UG programme is mandated to complete a minimum of 120 credits and the student of 4 year Honors degree shall complete 160 credits.

NEP Framework has specified the minimum number of credits that a Bachelor student has to earn in 3/4 year period. The table below specifies the number of credits and number of courses that a 3 year UG student and a 4 year UG Honours Degree student is expected to complete in 3 and 4-year duration respectively.

The National Service Scheme (NSS):

The college has one NSS Unit which started in the year The total strength enrolled is 100 who actively participate in various national level camps. Besides the Unit also organizes and participates in various social services like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Tree plantation and awareness programme, health check-up camp in rural areas etc.

NCC (National Cadet Corps):

The college has one NCC Unit under 16 BENGAL BN NCC, Darjeeling Group, West Bengal and Sikkim Directorate which started in the year 2017. At present there are 65 NCC cadets enrolled. The cadets actively participates in various national level camps like Republic Day Camp, Thal Sainik Camp, EBSB Camp etc. Besides the Unit also organizes and participates in various social services like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, tree plantation and awareness programme etc.

Conduct and Discipline:

- 1) **Each Student is provided with an Identity Card with his/her Photograph**, attested by the Principal of the College. This is an important document and should be carefully preserved. Students must come to the college with their college identity card which they should produce on demand.
- 2) **It is mandatory for all the enrolled student to wear college uniform in the college.**
- 3) **The students must follow the college web-site and Notice Board every day to keep himself /herself properly informed through various notices issued by the college from time to time.** Ignorance of any fact circulated through any notice for reasons of non-persual of the notice on the part of any student, for whatever grounds, shall not entitle him to any special treatment.
- 4) **Misbehavior with the teachers and staff is a serious offence** and may lead to the expulsion of the offender.
- 5) Ragging includes rowdy, undisciplined activity causing physical or psychological injury to any student. Physical, sexual or verbal abuse is also considered as ragging. The college can take necessary steps as suspension, debarring from examination, withholding results, expulsion, cancellation of admission, rustication to student(s) found guilty of the offence.
- 6) **Outsiders are not permitted within the College** premises and students must not bring outsiders to the college for any reason.
- 7) **Shouting** inside the college is **not permitted. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited within the class room during the class.**
- 8) **Loitering in the corridor, disturbing classes, copying in examinations, are treated as misconduct** and breach of discipline and warrant punitive action.
- 9) **Students are to maintain discipline inside and outside the College. Smoking, spitting of 'pan masala' in the College Verandahs, Common Rooms, Lawns and Class Rooms is strictly prohibited.**

Attendance and College Examination:

- 1) A student must attend 75% of the total number of classes held during the course of study for obtaining the eligibility for preparing in the Annual Test Examination as well as University Examination.
- 2) **It is compulsory for all students to appear for all college tests and examinations and score the requisite pass marks, along with necessary class attendance, in order to be promoted to the next higher class.**

Registration:

After admission every student is required to get himself/herself registered with the University of North Bengal. Admission of a student migrating from an academic board or university other than the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or the University of North Bengal remains provisional and as such is liable to cancellation if the migration certificate and other necessary documents are not submitted in due time or the University of North Bengal does not approve the Migration.

Form Fill-up for the University Exam:

As per the University of North Bengal Notification.

Subject change:

No change of Subject, and change from General to Honours category and vice versa shall be granted after the filling in the Registration form by the candidates.

General:

- 1) **All applications of the students addressed to the Principal must come through the College Office.**
- 2) **The college shall abide by the pattern for holidays and recess** as may be determined by the University from time to time. During the recess, classes shall remain suspended.
- 3) **The academic session of the college begins from the 1st day of July of every year and ends on the 30th June of the following year.**
